Have you had a job this serious before?

Yes, I have had many serious jobs during my working life and also in the voluntary work that I do. I trained and practiced as a social worker and had responsibility for many children looked after by the local authority as well as 'at risk' when living with their family. Later, I had responsibility for budgets of many £millions when I was a deputy director of Social Services.

Have you had any previous experience?

Yes, some years ago I was a school governor for eight years at Kerr Mackie Primary School. During that time I served as the chair of the School Governors for over two years. I enjoyed being a school governor, working with the head teacher and staff team to improve the school and the experience of the children.

Do you have any children at Talbot?

My two children attended Talbot School in the 1990's when Mr Dougill was the Head Teacher. The school was very different in those days, and the things I notice most when I visit the school now are the improvements to the building and the playground and the bright displays in the class rooms.

What is your job at the moment?
