


## Four online resources for home learning

	Resource	Intended Audience and access	Description
	DB Primary	<u>Whole School - linked to individual year groups and teachers.</u> Each child has their own login details that match their school accounts. Speak to your teacher if they lose them.	This provides a closed community for pupils to message each other safely. They can upload and download projects from school to home and vice versa. Teachers sometimes set challenges or tasks via DB Primary or showcase work done in class.
	Education City	<u>Whole School - particularly suitable for younger pupils.</u> The children access Education City through DB Primary removing the need for a separate password.	Education City's games are presented comically; key English and Maths resources linked to Age-Related Expectations. If pupils make a mistake, an explanation is provided. Pupils can reinforce or extend their learning by working in any year group.
	Bug Club	<u>Whole school - particularly suitable for pupils who need to develop their comprehension skills.</u> Each child has their own login details that match their school accounts. Speak to your teacher if they lose them. You also need the school code: qhh9.	Bug Club is an online reading scheme funded by the PTA. Teachers allocate books to each pupil; this means the texts are pitched to their individual reading levels. There are comprehension questions that test the pupils' grasp of the texts.
	IXL	<u>Whole School - particularly suitable for older pupils.</u> This is a commercial site which parents/carers can subscribe to. However, you can do English and 10 Maths questions each day for free, making it a great way to do bite sized home learning.	IXL has no nonsense questions that support fluency in Maths and English. Their extensive resources are linked to the Age-Related Expectations. If pupils make a mistake, an explanation is provided. Children can work up or down years if they desire.
